



Community Garden Project

The community garden is located between the Fishermead Trinity Centre and the Co-Operative Store and is being built on disused land along Fishermead Boulevard.

Funding has been sought from MK Community Foundation to cover the costs of fencing off the area and the initial clearance of the site so as to improve not only the appearance of the abandoned site but also to improve security..

Frosts garden centre have donated their time to draw a plan for the area to allow for easy access and successful planting throughout the year, maximising space within the garden.

The area has yet to be landscaped however we will keep everyone informed as this project progresses.

The idea is that a loosely organized collection of nice people who are interested in growing food and / or the community can "belong" by just showing up. The garden will be open to all members of the public and will be run in collaboration with local schools and will support education within the community

"Share the work, share the harvest!" There will be no compulsory fees, timed work requirements, or forms to fill out -- just call in, grab a hoe/weed/vegetable, and strike up a conversation or telephone the centre for more information. Basic instruction can be given and may include organised events such as cooking demonstrations
